Learning outcomes

On successful completion of the course, the doctoral student will be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

• summarize and present research questions, methods and theories used in research in Public Administration and it's sub disciplines

Competence and skills

- compare and analyze similarities and differences regarding choice of methods and theories covered in the course
- identify new research questions within the sub disciplines of Public Administration which the course is focused on, as well as problematize possible theoretical and methodological perspective related to these questions

Judgment and approach

• reflect and maintain a critical perspective towards theories and conclusions within the field of Public Administration and it's sub disciplines

Course content

The course presents an overview of international and Swedish research in the multidisciplinary field of Public Administration. Fundamental questions regarding theoretical perspectives and assumptions, as well as normative aspirations and incitements within the field, are problematized from a number of different thematical approaches. Example of such themes can be local government studies, sustainability, control and accountability, interactive collaborative governance, public management, etc.

Types of instruction

The format of the instruction for the course will be introductory lectures and seminars.

Language of instruction

The course is given in Swedish.

Grades

The grade Pass (G) or Fail (U) is given in this course.

Types of assessment

The course in assessed through the production of papers, one for each of the themes and a final course paper covering all themes, as well as through active participation in obligatory seminars.

A doctoral student who has failed a test twice has the right to change examiners. In order to change examiners, a written application must be sent to the Head of Department.

Course evaluation

A course evalutation is conducted at the end of the course. Any changes in the course content, literature or pedagogy will be presented at the next course introduction.
