On completion of the course, the student will be able to:

#### Knowledge and understanding

• demonstrate a good understanding of theories and methods within the field of second language acquisition

#### Competence and skills

- discuss different theories and methods within the field of second language acquisition
- apply different data collection methods and analytical techniques within this research subject
- relate empirical phenomena to relevant second language acquisition theories
- formulate their own research questions with relevance for research on second language acquisition
- plan and/or carry out a well-defined empirical study which is relevant to the field

#### Judgement and approach

• critically and independently evaluate analyses, theories and methods within the field of second language acquisition.

#### Course content

This course offers in-depth knowledge about well-established theoretical approaches to the study of second language acquisition from psycholinguistic and sociolinguistic perspectives. The course focuses on biological, psychologial and cognitive aspects as well as social and cultural factors and their role for second language acquisition in both formal and informal contexts for learners of different age groups. Particular emphasis is put on developmental patterns and variability in the processes of learning a second language. The course aims to develop both theoretical and methodological skills.

## Types of instruction

Lectures, seminars and self-study.

#### Language of instruction

The course is given in Swedish but can be given in English if necessary.

#### **Grades**

The grade Pass (G) or Fail (U) is given in this course.

## Types of assessment

Assessment consists of assignments throughout the course and an oral presentation and/or a short essay (5–10 pages) at the end of the course.

#### Course evaluation
